JUDGMENT

DEPUTY BAILIFF: Malone, you are placed on probation for a period of one year on condition that you behave throughout that time; that you live and work as directed by your Probation Officer; but with a further condition that you will reside at Marie Lodge Drug Rehabilitative Home for so long as directed by your Probation Officer. The Court also makes an order that such drugs as came into the possession of the police be destroyed.

We have read the report from Marie Lodge which shows that during your four weeks of assessment you have been trying very hard. We hope that you will continue to try very hard and that you will complete your period very successfully, but if you don't you have been warned by the prosecution and I am sure the Court agrees that if you were to come back here you will undoubtedly go to prison for quite a long time.
