Breach of probation order imposed on 10th May, 1991, in respect of 1 count of taking vehicle without owner's authority (Art. 28 of Road Traffic (Jersey) Law, 1956) (count 1 of Indictment); 2 counts of breaking & entering with intent (counts 2 & 3); 1 count of malicious damage (count 4).

## Conclusions.

Probation order to be discharged.

Counts 1,4: 3 months;

Counts 2,3: 6 months, all concurrent.

## Court's sentence.

Counts 1,4: 2 months;

Counts 2,3: 4 months, all concurrent.

JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: You have been given every chance to pull yourself together and co-operate with those who want to help you, but you have not done so for various reasons and we have little option but to send you to prison.

However, in view of what your counsel has said, we are going to vary the length of sentence and you will be sentenced to a total of four months' imprisonment in place of six. On Count 1 of the original Indictment you are sentenced to two months' imprisonment; on Count 2 you are sentenced to four months' imprisonment concurrent; on Count 3 you are sentenced to four months' imprisonment concurrent; and on Count 4 you are sentenced to two months' imprisonment concurrent, making a total of four months' imprisonment.
