JUDGMENT

THE DEPUTY BAILIFF: The Health and Safety at Work (Jersey) Law, 1989, is a law to protect employees who are exposed to risks to their health or safety.

5 We appreciate everything that Mr. Gollop has said, that this
accident might, perhaps, not have occurred if there had not been
pressure of work, but an accident did happen. Whether or not it
might have been fatal we do not know and we agree with Mr. Gollop
10 that we do not have sufficient evidence to support that
supposition by the Crown Advocate.

We appreciate that the Company has a very good record and is
very concerned about this accident having occurred, but we really



cannot see any reason to alter the conclusions of the Crown Advocate and therefore the Company is fined, what was requested, £1,500 and £250 costs.
