1 count of conduct likely to cause a breach of the peace (count 3).

*[On 10th January, 1997, the accused and two co-accused pleaded not guilty to two counts of grave and criminal assault (counts 1 & 2); the two co-accused also pleaded not guilty to the above count 3, to which the accused pleaded guilty. The two co-accused were acquitted of all charges on 17th January, 1997, and the accused was also acquitted on counts 1 & 2].*

Plea: Guilty.

Age: 29.

Details of Offence: Involved in a pub fight and ejected. Returned to pub and ejected again.

Details of Mitigation:

Jury had acquitted him and two others of grave and criminal assault on two victims and acquitted co-accused of conduct likely to cause a breach of the peace.

Previous Convictions: Being concerned in stolen motor vehicle; taking and driving away; burglary; drunk and disorderly.

Conclusions: £150 fine.

Sentence and Observations of the Court: £25 fine; two weeks to pay.
