Decision

Decision to strike case out

1. Mr Aldritt sent a notice of appeal form to the Tribunal which was received on Friday 4 September 2015. In his notice of appeal he sought to appeal against a decision of the National Police Chiefs' Council about the retention of information about him.
2. This Tribunal does not have jurisdiction to deal with such a case, a complaint may be made to the Information Commissioner's Office, there may be also remedies available via the civil courts.
3. The Tribunal wrote to Mr Aldritt by letter dated 4 September 2015 asking him for representations about why his case should not be struck out. He was asked to make representations on/by 11 September (subsequently extended to 8 October). Mr Aldritt has now written to the Tribunal saying "...it appears that this appeal should have been directed to the ICO.". I take that as his representations about the question of striking the case out in that he accepts that this Tribunal does not have jurisdiction.
4. Therefore, pursuant to *rule 8(2)(a)* the Tribunal strikes the case out.

This decision was made by the Tribunal's Registrar. A party is entitled to apply in writing within 14 days of the date of this document for this decision to be considered afresh by a Judge.
