

# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR) Decision notice

**Public Authority: Ribble Valley Borough Council**

## **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

- 1. The complainant requested information from Ribble Valley Borough Council (the public authority). By the date of this notice the public authority had not issued a substantive response to this request.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the public authority has failed to respond to the request within 20 working days and has therefore breached regulation 5(2) of the EIR.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the the public authority to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
  - Issue a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under the EIR.<sup>1</sup>
- 4. The public authority must take these steps within 30 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court

pursuant to section 54 of the Freedom of Information Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

## Request and response

5. On 23 April 2024, the complainant made the following request for information to the public authority:

"It is my understanding that the Council are responsible for the compliance of the Platform Gallery steps in Clitheroe with all regulations.

1. Please provide proof that the steps outside of the Platform Gallery in Clitheroe met all buildings standards regulations at the time of their construction.

This may be in the form of the Buildings Regulations in force at the time of their construction, or proof that the steps were signed off by a named individual at Ribble Valley Borough Council as meeting all standards and being safe for the public to use at the inspection following their construction.

- 2. Please provide all evidence that the Council have satisfied themselves that steps are safe for use by the public today.
- 3. Please provide a figure of how many known accidents or injuries have been caused by the steps since their construction."

### Reasons for decision

6. Regulation 5(1) of the EIR states that:

"a public authority that holds environmental information shall make it available on request."

7. Regulation 5(2) of the EIR states that:

"Information shall be made available under paragraph (1) as soon as possible and no later than 20 working days after the date of receipt of the request."

8. The Commissioner contacted the public authority on 15 July 2024 reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant within 10 working days. Despite this



intervention the public authority has failed to respond to the complainant.

9. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the public authority did not deal with the request for information in accordance with the EIR. The Commissioner's decision is that the public authority has breached regulation 5(2) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with the EIR.



# Right of appeal

10. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
