Their Lordships do not desire to call upon the Respondent in this case.

They think that the Appellants have not shown any ground for disturbing the unanimous judgment of the Supreme Court of Canada. They agree with the Supreme Court in thinking that the "Senlac" was navigated with a reckless disregard of her own safety and the safety of any other vessel which might be approaching her.

Their Lordships have had an opportunity of conferring with the Nautical Assessors, and that is their view also.

Their Lordships will therefore humbly advise His Majesty that this Appeal should be dismissed.

The Appellants must pay the costs.
