Their Lordships have had before them the materials which were before the High Court, namely, the evidence taken by the Officiating Subordinate Judge and his judgment as set out in the order sheet. Their Lordships are unable to say that, in declining to act upon the conclusion of the Officiating Subordinate Judge, the High Court was wrong, and their Lordships are unable to say that, in exercising its discretion in the way in which it did exercise it in favour of the plaintiff the High Court, on the materials before it, was wrong.

Their Lordships will therefore humbly advise His Majesty that this appeal fails, and must be dismissed.
