ROAD TRAFFIC

The M6 Motorway (Northbound Exit Slip Road Leading to Rob Lane Motorway Depot) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made - - - - *18 January 2011*

Coming into force - - *6 February 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway and slip roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those slip roads in the Borough of St Helens in Merseyside should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Northbound Exit Slip Road Leading to Rob Lane Motorway Depot) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 6 February 2011.

2. In this Order;

“motorway” means the M6 Motorway;

“works” means sign and road marking improvement works on the slip road;

“the works period” means five nights between 2100 hours and 0500 hours starting on Monday 7 February 2011 and ending on Saturday 12 February 2011. However, work may start and continue between the same times on subsequent nights or continue overnight until completed, for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

“the slip road” means the exit slip road leading from the northbound carriageway of the motorway to Rob Lane Motorway Depot.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle, which is normally authorised to use the slip road, to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue or ambulance services, vehicles being used in connection with the works, or by traffic officers, or to any vehicle proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
