**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A66 Trunk Road (Layby at Boathouse Lane Interchange)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

*Made* - - - - *25th August 2011*

*Coming into force* - - *5th September 2011*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A66 Trunk Road, in the in the District of Stockton-on-Tees, is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road should be prohibited because layby reconstruction works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A66 Trunk Road (Layby at Boathouse Lane Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 5th September 2011.

2. In this Order “the layby” means an area of carriageway, situated adjacent to the A66 Trunk Road westbound carriageway approximately 370 metres east of the overbridge at Boathouse Lane Interchange overbridge, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order no person shall, during a period of 10 hours commencing at 20:00 hours on Tuesday 6th September 2011 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or wait in the layby.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.
