ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M5 Motorway (Junction 19 Northbound Entry Slip Road)
(Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - 25 January 2011
Coming into force - - 29 January 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads at Junction 19 in North Somerset should be prohibited and restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 19 Northbound Entry Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 29 January 2011.

2. In this Order –

“the slip road” means the northbound entry slip road at M5 Junction 19;

“the works” mean slip road widening, lighting, safety fencing and drainage;

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 31 January 2011 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

“the works period” means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 31 January 2011 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

6. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the said works, for traffic officer purposes or for winter maintenance purposes.
