ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M69 and M6 Motorways (M6 Junction 2) (Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - 28th December 2011

Coming into force - - 4th January 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M69 Motorway (“the M69”), the M6 Motorway (“the M6”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those connecting roads, northeast of Coventry and in the County of Warwickshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The M69 and M6 Motorways (M6 Junction 2) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 4th January 2012.

2. In this Order –

“a link road” means the link road leading from the southbound carriageway of the M69 to the northbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 2;

“the slip road” means the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M6 from its roundabout junction with the B4600/Hinckley Road at Junction 2;

“the works period” means the period starting at 22:00 hours on Monday 9th January 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on a link road and or the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
