ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A404(M) Motorway (Junction 9a – M4 Junction 8/9)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	<i>11th June 2012</i>
<i>Coming into force</i> - -	<i>30th June 2012</i>

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A404(M) Motorway and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that motorway and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A404(M) Motorway (Junction 9a – M4 Junction 8/9) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 30th June 2012.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the A404(M) Motorway in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead;

“the length of carriageway” means the southbound carriageway of the motorway between Junction 9a and the roundabout at M4 Junction 8/9 (A308(M));

“the slip road” means the road leading to the southbound carriageway of the motorway at Junction 9a;

“works” mean carriageway repairs and associated work on the motorway; and

“a works period” means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Monday 2nd July 2012 or on any subsequent day until 29th December 2013.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of carriageway or the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
