**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal International
Air Tattoo RAF Fairford) (No. 2) (Amendment No. 2)
Regulations 2012**

Made - - - - *6th July 2012*

Coming into force - - *7th July 2012*

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying by reason of the intended flypast of a large formation of aircraft that is scheduled to take place at RAF Fairford, Gloucestershire, on 7th and 8th July 2012.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal International Air Tattoo RAF Fairford) (No. 2) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2012 and come into force on 7th July 2012.

Amendment of Regulations

2.—(1) The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal International Air Tattoo RAF Fairford) (No. 2) Regulations 2012(b) are further amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 3(4)(a), for the words “West Midlands Police” substitute “West Mercia Police”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations further amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal International Air Tattoo RAF Fairford) (No. 2) Regulations 2012 (S.I. 2012/1232) (“the principal Regulations”). The amendment corrects an error in relation to one of the exemptions to the flying restrictions imposed by the principal Regulations.

Full details of the restricted airspace will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
