ROAD TRAFFIC

The A259 Trunk Road (Rye) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *10th December 2012*

Coming into force - - *5th January 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A259 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted and prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A259 Trunk Road (Rye) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 5th January 2013.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A259 Trunk Road northeast of Hastings in the County of East Sussex;

“the length of trunk road” means both carriageways of the trunk road between a point 100 metres south of its junction with Harbour Road and its junction with the western side of King’s Avenue at Rye;

“street parking places” means parking places on land which does and does not, form part of the road;

“the A259 street parking places” means the parking places on the length of trunk road;

“works” mean street lighting and drainage work on the trunk road;

“a first works period” means a period of 24 hours starting at 0001 hours on Sunday 6th January 2013 or on any subsequent day until 4th July 2014; and

“a second works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Sunday 6th January 2013 or on any subsequent day until 4th July 2014.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 below, no person shall, during a first works period, cause or permit any vehicle to load, unload, or wait on, the A259 street parking places.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 below, no person shall, during a second works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the length of trunk road while traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on that length of road are displayed.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. (1) Nothing in article 3 above shall apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.

(2) Nothing in article 4 above shall apply to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire and rescue authority purposes and to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
