ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A2 Trunk Road (Dunkirk, Eastbound) (Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - - *10th December 2012*

Coming into force - - *2nd January 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A2 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A2 Trunk Road (Dunkirk, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 2nd January 2013.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A2 Trunk Road at Dunkirk in the County of Kent;

“the slip road” means the road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road from London Road at Dunkirk;

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

“the lay-by” means the lay-by in the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road 800 metres east of the centre of Canterbury Road overbridge at Dunkirk;

“works” mean cycleway renewal work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 9½ hours starting at 1930 hours on Wednesday 2nd January 2013 or on any subsequent day until 1st July 2014.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period cause or permit any vehicle to –

- (i) enter or proceed in, or wait on, an A2 lay-by, or
- (ii) enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
