**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A30 Trunk Road (Staines By-Pass, Lay-By)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

*Made* - - - - *17th December 2012*

*Coming into force* - - *26th January 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A30 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A30 Trunk Road (Staines By-Pass, Lay-By) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 26th January 2013.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A30 Trunk Road (Staines By-Pass) in the County of Surrey;

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

“the A30 lay-by” means the lay-by in the Londonbound carriageway of the trunk road 1600 metres east of M25 Junction 13 (B376);

“works” mean gas main maintenance work on the trunk road; and

"a works period" means a period of 24 hours starting at 0001 hours on Monday 28th January 2013 or on any subsequent day until 25th July 2014.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on, the A30 lay-by.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. (1) Nothing in article 3 above shall apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
