**The M180 Motorway (Junction 4, Broughton) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - *9th February 2012*

Coming into force - *18th February 2012*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M180 Motorway and connecting roads, in the County of North Lincolnshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway should be restricted and prohibited because safety barrier renewal works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M180 Motorway (Junction 4, Broughton) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 18th February 2012.

2. In this Order; –

“the M180” means the M180 Motorway;

“the first length of eastbound carriageway” and “the first length of westbound carriageway” mean, respectively, the eastbound and westbound carriageways of the M180 from a point 1800 metres west of the centreline of the Ermine Street western overbridge eastwards for a distance of 3700 metres;

“the second length of eastbound carriageway” means the M180 eastbound carriageway between the nose of the eastbound exit slip road and the nose of the eastbound entry slip road at Junction 4 (Broughton), a distance of 1300 metres;

“the second length of westbound carriageway” means the M180 westbound carriageway between the nose of the westbound exit slip road and the nose of the westbound entry slip road at Junction 4, a distance of 1300 metres;

“the first works period” means the period starting at 00:01 hours on Sunday 19th February 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

“the second works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Sunday 19th February 2012 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the first works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of eastbound carriageway or the first length of westbound carriageway.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the second works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of eastbound carriageway or the second length of westbound carriageway .

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs. Nothing in article 4 shall apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 3 shall apply to any vehicle being used for a purpose specified in paragraph (a) of this article.

6. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
