ROAD TRAFFIC

The A453 Trunk Road (Clifton, Nottingham) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *20th February 2012*
Coming into force - - *27th February 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A453 Trunk Road (“the A453”) is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Clifton in the City of Nottingham, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) , and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A453 Trunk Road (Clifton, Nottingham) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 27th February 2012.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the –
(a) northbound carriageway of the A453 approximately 150 metres north east of its junction with Village Road; and
(b) southbound carriageway of the A453 approximately 35 metres north of its junction with Green Lane;

“bus stop area” means any area of a carriageway on a side of the trunk road, intended for the waiting of buses, which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1025, 1025.1, 1025.3 or 1025.4 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

“the footway” means the footway adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A453, from a point 10 metres north east of its junction with Village Road for a distance of 20 metres;

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

“the works period”

means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 5th March 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the bus stop area.
4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any pedestrian to enter or proceed in the footway.
5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle or pedestrian-
 - (i) engaged in police, fire brigade or ambulance activities,
 - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or
 - (iii) engaged in connection with the said works.
