**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A27 Trunk Road (Arundel Road, Crockerhill) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

*Made* - - - - - *17th June 2013*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *6th July 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A27 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on some of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A27 Trunk Road (Arundel Road, Crockerhill) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 6th July 2013.

**2.** In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A27 Trunk Road in the County of West Sussex;

“Nyton Road” means the road known as Nyton Road (B2233) at Crockerhill at its junction with the westbound carriageway of the trunk road;

“a side road” means any road leading to or from the westbound carriageway of the trunk road at Nyton Road junction (B2233) at Crockerhill;

“works” mean the installation of road signs work on the trunk road; and

“the works period” means the period starting on Monday 8th July 2013 and ending on 7th January 2015.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle –

(a) to enter or proceed in a side road; or

(b) to turn right from the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road into Nyton Road (B2233) at Crockerhill;

**4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

(a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
