ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A1(M) Motorway (Junction 63 to Junction 62) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

Made - - - *29th August 2013*

Coming into force - *8th September 2013*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1(M) Motorway and connecting roads, in the County of Durham, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway and some of those connecting roads should be restricted and prohibited because road marking and routine maintenance works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A1(M) Motorway (Junction 63 to Junction 62) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 8th September 2013.

2. In this Order:-

“the A1(M)” means the A1(M) Motorway;

“the first length of carriageway” means the A1(M) southbound carriageway from a point 600 metres south of the centreline of Washington Road overbridge to a point approximately 150 metres south of the nose of the southbound entry slip road at Junction 62 (Carville), a distance of approximately 11,150 metres;

“the second length of carriageway” means the A1(M) southbound carriageway from the nose of the southbound exit slip road at Junction 63 (Blind Lane) to the nose of the southbound entry slip road at Junction 62, a distance of 9,300 metres;

“a slip road” means any of the following A1(M) slip roads:

- (i) southbound entry slip road at Junction 63; or
- (ii) southbound exit slip road at Junction 62;

“the works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 9th September 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of carriageway.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of carriageway or a slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs. Nothing in article 4 shall apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 3 shall apply to a vehicle being used for the purpose specified in paragraph (a) of this article.

6. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011^(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
