ROAD TRAFFIC

The A46 Trunk Road (Wanlip, Leicestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

Made - - - - - *6th September 2013*

Coming into force - - - *13th September 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A46 Trunk Road (“the A46”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and two of those connecting roads, at Wanlip in the County of Leicestershire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A46 Trunk Road (Wanlip, Leicestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 13th September 2013.

2. In this Order –

“the trunk road” means –

- i) the eastbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the slip road leading to the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip to its junction with the slip road leading from Fillingate; and
- ii) the westbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the slip road leading to Rectory Road at Wanlip to its junction with slip road leading from the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip;

“a slip road” means –

- i) the slip road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the A46 from the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip; and

- ii) the slip road leading from the westbound carriageway of the A46 to the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a road marking of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 (a) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the marking is placed; and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in a length of the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a suitable surface for the exercise of that right;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Friday 20th September 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the trunk road or a slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the layby situated adjacent to –

- i) the eastbound carriageway of the A46 211 metres east of its junction with the exit slip road leading to the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip;
- ii) the westbound carriageway of the A46 200 metres east of its junction with entry slip road leading from the roundabout junction with the A6 at Wanlip; and
- iii) the westbound carriageway of the A46 70 metres east of the centreline of Rectory Road underbridge.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle-

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
- (c) being used in connection with the said works.
