**The A66 Trunk Road (Walkmill to Brough Bypass) (Temporary
Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2013**

Made - - - - *18th October 2013*

Coming into force - - *3rd November 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport being the traffic authority for the A66 Trunk Road is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road in the District of Eden in the County of Cumbria, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A66 Trunk Road (Walkmill to Brough Bypass) (Temporary Prohibition and Restriction of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 3rd November 2013.

2. In this Order:

 “the trunk road” means the A66 Trunk Road:

 “the first length of carriageway” means the carriageway of the trunk road from a point 785 metres west of the centreline of the junction with the C3070 to Warcop, to a point 210 metres west of the centrepoint of Coltsford overbridge.

 “the second length of carriageway” means the carriageway of the trunk road from a point 215 metres east of the centreline of the junction with the C3070 to Warcop, to a point 1210 metres west of the centrepoint of Coltsford overbridge.

 “layby” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

 “the first layby to be closed” means the layby adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road situated 950 metres west of the centrepoint of Bongate Moor overbridge;

 “the second layby to be closed” means the layby adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road situated 1000 metres east of the centrepoint of Coltsford overbridge.

 “the works period” means a period starting at 0001 hours on Monday 4 November 2013 and ending at 2359 hours on Sunday 2 February 2014. Works may start and continue

beyond these dates for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the works;

“works” means resurfacing works on the trunk road.

“a local road” means a road leading to and from the trunk road described in this Order;

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 9 and 10 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any motor vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the first length of carriageway.
4. Subject as mentioned in articles 9 and 10 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any motor vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the second length of carriageway whilst traffic signs of a character authorised under Section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on that length of road are displayed.
5. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to overtake a moving vehicle or make a ‘U’ turn in the second length of carriageway.
6. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any motor vehicle with an overall width exceeding 3.20 metres (10 feet 6 inches) to enter or proceed in the first length of carriageway.
7. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave the trunk road by making a right or left turn into or out of the U3312 local road to Great Musgrave.
8. Subject as mentioned in article 9 of this Order no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first or second layby to be closed.
9. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services or anything done at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.

The provisions of articles 5, 6, 7 and 8 of this Order shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works, or by traffic officers.
10. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 (a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
