**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RAF Fairford,
Gloucestershire) (Amendment) Regulations 2014**

Made - - - - *4th September 2014*

Coming into force - - *5th September 2014*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the area of RAF Fairford, Gloucestershire, because a visit by the President of the United States of America that is scheduled to take place between 3rd and 5th September 2014 for the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation Wales Summit 2014.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009^(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RAF Fairford, Gloucestershire) (Amendment) Regulations 2014 and come into force on 5th September 2014.

Amendment of Regulations

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RAF Fairford, Gloucestershire) Regulations 2014^(b) are amended as follows.

3. In regulation 3 in paragraph (4)(b) replace “between 1530 hours and 1830 hours” with “between 1630 hours and 1930 hours”.

4. In regulation 3 in paragraph (6) replace “between 1530 hours and 1830 hours” with “between 1630 hours and 1930 hours”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (RAF Fairford, Gloucestershire) Regulations 2014 (S.I. 2014/) (“the principal Regulations”). The amendment changes the times of the airspace restrictions for the transfer of The President of the United States of America between Newport, Gwent, and RAF Fairford, that is scheduled to take place on 5th September 2014.
