CIVIL AVIATION

The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Turnberry) Regulations 2016

Made - - - - 23rd June 2016

Coming into force - - 24th June 2016

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Turnberry, Ayreshire by reason of the intended visit to the area by Mr Donald Trump, United States of America presumptive nominee for the Republican Party Presidential candidacy, on 24th June 2016.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Turnberry) Regulations 2016 and come into force on 24th June 2016.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0600 hours and 2200 hours on 24th June 2016, no aircraft is to fly below 2,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 1.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 551924N 0045007W.
 - (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—
 - (a) operated by or on behalf of Police Scotland,
 - (b) operated by or on behalf of the Scottish Air Ambulance Service,
 - (c) operated by or on behalf of the Maritime and Coastguard Agency, or
 - (d) flying in accordance with the permission of the Police Scotland Air Accidents and Incidents Advisor.

⁽b) In these Regulations Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the airspace in the vicinity of Turnberry, Ayreshire by reason of the intended visit to the area by Mr Donald Trump on 24th June 2016, United States of America Republican Party presumptive Presidential candidate. The Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that, at the request of the Police Scotland, flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety and security.

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2)(d), the Police Scotland Air Accidents and Incidents Advisor may be contacted on telephone number 07717 720591.

In relation to regulation 3, the term 'aircraft' includes aircraft as classified in Part A of Schedule 3 to the Air Navigation Order 2009. It also includes, by virtue of article 253(3) of that Order, any small balloon, any kite weighing not more than two kilograms, any small unmanned aircraft and any parachute including a parascending parachute.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Universal Co-ordinated Time (UTC), which for the purpose of these Regulations is one hour behind British Summer Time.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
