**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force
Waddington) Regulations 2021**

Made - - - - 29th November 2021

Coming into force - - 7th December 2021

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Royal Air Force Waddington, Lincolnshire by reason of the intended holding of flying display rehearsals there by a jet formation display team.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force Waddington) Regulations 2021 and they come into force on 7th December 2021.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1130 hours and 1300 hours on each of the three days of the 7th, 9th and 14th December 2021 no aircraft is to fly below 8,230 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 5 nautical miles whose centre is at 530958N 0003126W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the air traffic control unit at Royal Air Force Waddington.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Royal Air Force Waddington, Lincolnshire during flying display rehearsals by the Royal Air Force Aerobatic Team, the Red Arrows, which are due to take place there on the 7th, 9th and 14th December 2021. To protect the display aircraft and other air traffic the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport consider that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the airspace within which the display team will operate.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is the same as Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2), the air traffic control unit at RAF Waddington may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
