**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Ragley Hall,
Alcester) Regulations 2022**

Made - - - - 22nd March 2022

Coming into force - - 2nd June 2022

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of the area specified in regulation 3 by reason of the intended holding of flying displays that are scheduled to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Ragley Hall, Alcester) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 2nd June 2022.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1300 hours and 2100 hours on 2nd June 2022 and 1000 and 1730 hours on 3rd and 4th June 2022 no aircraft is to fly below 6,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 2.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 521128N 0015406W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying with the permission of the Midlands Air Festival flying display director.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Ragley Hall, Alcester, Warwickshire during air displays for the general public that are scheduled to take place there on 2nd June 2022 to 4th June 2022 (inclusive).

A large number of aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the displays for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).
