The Access to the Countryside (Coastal Margin) (Shotley Gate to Felixstowe) (No. 2) Order 2024

Made - - - - *15th October 2024*

Coming into force *16th October 2024*

The Secretary of State makes this Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 3A(10) of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000(a).

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Access to the Countryside (Coastal Margin) (Shotley Gate to Felixstowe) (No. 2) Order 2024 and comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.

(2) In this Order—

“the Act” means the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949(b);

“the relevant approvals” means the approval, by the Secretary of State(c) under section 52(1) of the Act(d) of the proposals contained in the—

- (a) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SGF1, Bristol Hill to embankment west of Orwell Bridge report on 31st August 2021;
- (b) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SGF2, Embankment west of Orwell Bridge to Priory Park report on 13th January 2021;
- (c) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SG4, Shore Lane, Nacton to Sea Road, Felixstowe report on 13th January 2021;
- (d) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SG5, Landguard Point to Martello Tower, Felixstowe Ferry report on 13th January 2021;

(c) The functions of the Secretary of State under sections 51 and 52 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 (c. 97) were originally vested in the Minister of Town and Country Planning in relation to England and Wales (see section 114(1) of that Act). The Minister of Town and Country Planning was renamed the Minister of Local Government and Planning by S.I. 1951/142 and was further renamed the Minister of Housing and Local Government by S.I. 1951/1900. S.I. 1965/143 transferred (so far as relevant) the functions of the Minister of Housing and Local Government to the Minister of Land and Natural Resources. The Ministry of Land and Natural Resources was dissolved by S.I. 1967/156 and the functions of that Minister (so far as relevant) were transferred to the Minister of Housing and Local Government. The Ministry of Housing and Local Government was dissolved, and the functions of that Minister were transferred to the Secretary of State by S.I. 1970/1681.

“the relevant reports” means the reports, submitted by Natural England to the Secretary of State under sections 51 and 55A of the Act(a) on 15th January 2020(b) entitled—

- (a) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SGF1, Bristol Hill to embankment west of Orwell Bridge;
- (b) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SGF2, Embankment west of Orwell Bridge to Priory Park;
- (c) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SGF4, Shore Lane, Nacton to Sea Road, Felixstowe;
- (d) England Coast Path Shotley Gate to Felixstowe SG5, Landguard Point to Martello Tower, Felixstowe Ferry.

End of access preparation period

2. In relation to land which is coastal margin as a result of the relevant approvals, the day appointed as the day on which the access preparation period(c) ends is 16th October 2024.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order appoints the day on which the access preparation period ends in relation to land which is coastal margin as a result of the approval, by the Secretary of State, of Natural England’s proposals contained in reports relating to coastal access upon the long-distance route between Shotley Gate and Felixstowe.
