## EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ITALY, REGARDING THE REVIVAL OF CERTAIN PRE-WAR TREATIES

His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome to the Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs

British Embassy,

Your Excellency, Rome, 2nd February, 1950.

As the result of correspondence which has recently taken place between His Majesty's Embassy and the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs it has been suggested that the following bilateral agreements between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Italy should be revived:—

- (1) Agreement relating to reciprocal extradition between Malta and Italy embodied in the Malta Ordinance No. 1 of 1863, dated Valetta, the 21st February, 1863, and the Italian Decree No. 1230, dated Turin, the 3rd May, 1863;
- (2) Agreement relating to reciprocal extradition between Malta and Italy embodied in the Malta Ordinance No. IV of 1880, dated Valetta, the 28th May, 1880, and the Italian Decree No. 5716, dated Monza, the 13th October, 1880;
- (3) Exchange of Notes for the Reciprocal Recognition of Proof Marks, London, the 24th June, 1926.(1)
- 2. I have now the honour to inform your Excellency, on the instructions of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are prepared to revive the above-mentioned agreements with the Italian Government. If the Italian Government agree to this proposal I have to suggest that the present Note and your Excellency's reply to that effect should be regarded as constituting an agreement on this matter between the two Governments, which shall take effect from this date.
