Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Danish Government relating to Money and Property situated in Denmark and the United Kingdom and subjected to special measures in consequence of the enemy occupation of Denmark, which was signed at London on the 6th December, 1945<sup>(1)</sup>, and to inform your Excellency that the Government of the United Kingdom consider that the purposes for which this Agreement was concluded have been achieved and that it may now be terminated.

2. If this view is shared by the Danish Government, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your Excellency's reply to that effect should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our respective Governments formally terminating with effect from to-day's date the above-mentioned Agreement of the 6th December, 1945.
