Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments relating to Air Services signed at London on 5th April, 1946,<sup>(1)</sup> and the subsequent Exchanges of Letters of 1947, 1948, 1951, 1952,<sup>(2)</sup> 1956,<sup>(3)</sup> 1958,<sup>(4)</sup> 1959,<sup>(5)</sup> 1960,<sup>(6)</sup> 1961,<sup>(7)</sup> 1964<sup>(8)</sup> and 1965<sup>(9)</sup> modifying the Agreement, and to discussions which have taken place between the aeronautical authorities of our respective Governments regarding the further modification of Schedule IV of the Annex to the Agreement.

In pursuance of those discussions and of Article 8 of the Air Services Agreement the United Kingdom Government propose that in the said Schedule IV for route 2 shall be substituted "2. Manchester-Dublin" and after route 21 shall be added "22. Liverpool-Dublin" and that, as regards capacity control, Article 8 (iii) of the Annex to the Air Services Agreement shall apply to those routes.

If your Government agree to the above proposals I suggest that this Letter and your reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between our two Governments.

Please accept, Your Excellency, the renewed assurance of my highest consideration.
