The Prime Minister of Malta to the United Kingdom High Commissioner at Floriana

Minister of Commonwealth and Foreign Affairs,
My dear High Commissioner,
Malta, 23rd December, 1968.

I refer to the Agreement between the Government of Malta and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland for Air Services between and beyond their respective terrritories which was signed at Valletta on 10 July, 1967.(1) The Government of Malta propose that the following amendments should be made to the Schedule annexed to the Agreement:—

Part I

below "(3) Manchester" in the first column insert "(4) Birmingham"; below "Malta" in the third column insert "Malta".

Part II

below "(3) Malta" in the first column insert "(4) Malta"; below "Manchester" in the third column insert "Birmingham".

2. If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland I suggest that this Letter and your reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments in this matter, which shall enter into force on this day's date.
