Your Excellency,

19 February, 1970.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, concerning the Abolition of Visas as constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 29th of April, 1969.⁽¹⁾

I now have the honour to propose, on the instructions of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs, that the provisions of the said Agreement shall be extended to include the British overseas dependent territory of Gibraltar and that the Agreement shall be amended by the insertion of the words "and Gibraltar" after the words "Isle of Man" in sub-paraphraphs (a) and (e) of the first paragraph and the insertion of the words "or Gibraltar" after "or the Isle of Man" in sub-paraphraphs (b) and (d) of the first paragraph.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, I have the honour to suggest that this Note together with Your Excellency's reply to that effect shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

Vaša ekselencijo,

Čast mi je da potvrdim prijem note vaše ekselencije br. 17 od 19.II.1970. koja glasi:

"Čast mi je da se pozovem na Sporazum izmedju Kraljevine Velike Britanije i Severne Irske i vlade Socijalističke Federativne Republike Jugoslavije o ukidanju viza, postignut razmenom nota 29. aprila 1969.

Postupajući u skladu sa instrukcijama glavnog sekretara njenog veličanstva za inostrane poslove i poslove Komonvelta, sada imam čast da predložim da se odredbe pomenutog Sporazuma prošire tako da obuhvate i britansku prekomorskiju zavisnu teritoriju Gibraltar i da se Sporazum izmeni umetanjem reči 'i Gibraltar' posle reči 'Ostrvo Man' u tačkama /a/ i /e/ prvog stava i umetanjem reči 'ili Gibraltar' posle 'ili Ostrvo Man' u tačkama /b/ i /d/ prvog stava.

Ukoliko su prednji predlozi prihvatljivi za vladu Socijalističke Federativne Republike Jugoslavije, čast mi je da predložim da se ova nota i odgovor vaše ekselencije u tom smislu smatraju Sporazumom izmedju dve vlade o ovom pitanju."

Čast mi je da obavestim vašu ekselenciju da je prednji predlog prihvatljiv za vladu Socijalističke Federativne Republike Jugoslavije i da je ona, prema tome, saglasna da se nota vaše ekselencije, zajedno sa ovim odgovorom, smatra za Sporazum izmedju dve vlade o ovom pitanju.

Koristim ovu priliku da vašoj ekselenciji ponovim izraze svog dubokog poštovanja.
