BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF GHANA AMENDING THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT SIGNED AT LONDON ON 24 SEPTEMBER 1958

Sir,

3 July 1973.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Ghana for Air Services between and beyond their respective territories signed at London on 24 September 1958(1) and to propose that Column 2 of Route 4 of Section (a) of the Schedule to that Agreement shall be amended by the substitution of "Casablanca" for "Tangier".

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of Ghana I have the honour to propose that this Note and Your Excellency's reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments in this matter which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
