Sir,

I have the honour to refer to discussions that have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Sierra Leone concerning the continuance of the British Expatriates Supplementation (Sierra Leone) Agreement 1971⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and certain matters related to passage costs and medical expenses thereunder and to propose that the Agreement be amended as follows:—

- (1) In sub-paragraph 2 of paragraph 1 after the word "grant" add the punctuation and words ", medical expenses".
- (2) In sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph 1 delete the words and figures "31st March 1976" and substitute therefor the words and figures "31st March 1981".
- (3) In paragraph 1 of the Second Annex after the word "payments" add the words "and reimbursements" and after the words "annex to" add the words "or in respect of".
- (4) In paragraph 2 of the Second Annex add a further clause to read "(e) any medical expenses necessarily incurred on treatment not available under the local health service at such rates as may be specified from time to time by the Government of the United Kingdom".
- (5) Following paragraph 2 of the Second Annex add "B" after the figure "3" and insert a new paragraph 3A before it to read "3A. The Government of the United Kingdom will reimburse the employing authority the amount paid by the employing authority in providing for designated officers and their dependent families passages on such

occasions (not being occasions referred to in paragraph 3B of this Annex) as the Government of Sierra Leone may, with the prior concurrence of the Government of the United Kingdom, prescribe. Passages for designated officers and their dependent families should be, where available, by British carrier and where practicable by excursion or charter flight”.

If these proposals are acceptable to the Government of Sierra Leone, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and your reply shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on 31 March 1976, and that the Agreement as so amended shall be cited as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Sierra Leone) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76.
