Your Excellency

I have the honour to refer to the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") constituted by an Exchange of Letters dated 2 August 1976 between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Lesotho and to discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Lesotho concerning the provision of assistance to staff in the service of the Lesotho National Development Corporation and to place on record the agreement of our two Governments in that respect. The Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Lesotho agree, under the provisions of paragraph 1 of the Agreement to add the following to the list of employing authorities in the second Annex to that Agreement:

The Lesotho National Development Corporation.

If this Letter correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed I have the honour to propose that this Letter and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of your reply and shall be cited as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Lesotho) Agreement 1976 Amendment 1977.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
