In this connection the Permanent Mission of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic to the United Nations wishes to inform the Secretary-General that the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic does not consider itself to be bound by the above-mentioned

reservation.

The principle of the inviolability of diplomatic mail, as stated in paragraphs 3 and 4 of Article 27 of the Vienna Convention, is generally recognized in international law and is absolute and without exception in the sphere of its applicability."

In a communication received by the Secretary-General of the United Nations on 7 November, 1977, the Government of the Soviet Union made the following declaration concerning the reservation by the Government of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya in respect of Article 27 at the time of accession:
