Dear Minister

I have the honour to refer to the Exchange of Notes between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Singapore regarding Assistance for the Armed Forces of Singapore and the Arrangements for a United Kingdom Force in Singapore, of 1 December 1971<sup>(1)</sup>.

Following the discussions between representatives of our two Governments in 1975 about the arrangements concerning the naval facilities at Sembawang, I have the honour to propose that the following consequential amendments should be made to the Exchange of Notes to reflect the administrative changes made in the arrangements concerning the facilities:

- (a) In paragraph 2(e) of the Exchange of Notes and elsewhere, the term "civilian component" shall be deemed to include also United Kingdom civilian personnel, not being personnel accompanying a United Kingdom force, who are employed in managing the installations made available to the United Kingdom under the Exchange of Notes;
- (b) Annex III, Section 6, paragraph 7, shall be amended by inserting the words "Australian or New Zealand" after "United Kingdom" and before "force".
- (c) In Annex IV, Schedules I and II shall be deleted and replaced by the new Schedules I and II annexed to this Note.

If the foregoing is acceptable to the Government of Singapore, I have the honour to propose that this Note and the Schedules annexed thereto together with your reply to that effect shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments in this matter which shall enter into force on 26 July 1978.
